

**TOWANDA BOROUGH
ORDINANCE NO. 2011-2**

AN ORDINANCE WHICH (1) REQUIRES ALL OPERATORS OF VEHICLES TRAVELING ON WILLIAM STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF TOWANDA, PENNSYLVANIA TO COME TO A COMPLETE STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF WILLIAM STREET AND CHESTNUT STREET BEFORE ENTERING INTO SAID INTERSECTION; (2) ESTABLISHES A PENALTY FOR A VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE; (3) DIRECTS THAT APPROPRIATE STOP SIGNS BE PLACED AT SAID INTERSECTION, AND (4) INDICATES THE ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY UPON IT'S ENACTMENT.

WHEREAS, vehicles traveling on William Street within the Borough of Towanda, Pennsylvania need to come to a full stop, for safety reasons, before entering the intersection of William Street and Chestnut Street.

WHEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED as follows:

- I.
 - A. Any operator of a vehicle traveling on William Street in the Borough of Towanda, Pennsylvania shall bring said vehicle to a complete stop before entering the intersection of William Street and Chestnut Street.
 - B. Any operator of a motor vehicle who violates this Section shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall be subject to the penalties set forth in section 68-74 of the Code of the Borough of Towanda, Pennsylvania.
- II. Stop signs shall be placed before the northwest and southeast corners of said William Street at it's intersection with Chestnut Street.
- III. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment.
